INTRODUCTION

There are four basic views to the book of Revelation. The *preterist* believes the prophecies have already been fulfilled. The *eclectic* spiritualizes the book and says it is full of symbols. The *idealist* view believes the account does not refer to any particular events but simply shows the struggle of Christianity and paganisim. And the *futurist* believes it contains the forecast of world history.

Although the book of Revelation has been misunderstood, argued over, or even avoided by many, it is special in that...
